RWPA MAI Funding in the SF EMA FY 09/10

OVERVIEW

The Minority AIDS Initiative legislation has three goals:

- To get persons from disproportionately impacted communities of color who are living with HIV disease into care services at an earlier stage of illness.
- To ensure access to new treatments consistent with established standards of care.
- To provide related support services to help individual and families remain in care.

SAN FRANCISCO EMA APPLICATION

- In FY 07/08, the San Francisco EMA submitted a proposal to HRSA for a three year funding cycle, the first year of which was competitive.
- SF HHS applied for \$4,412,340 to support the CoE targeting Latinos and treatment advocacy program targeting Latinos, to provide expanded support for case management in the CoE and to backfill cuts to programs (HHSPC Tiers II and III).
- As with other Ryan White Programs, these funds also had to follow the 75% formula for Core Services.

PART A MAI FUNDED SERVICES IN SF EMA FY 07/08 THROUGH FY 09/10

Funding levels:

- MAI funds awarded to SF EMA in FY 07/08 totaled **\$653,491** (22 % increase)
- MAI funds awarded to SF EMA in FY 08/09 totaled **\$641,576** (1.7 % decrease)
- MAI funds awarded to SF EMA in FY 09/10 totaled **\$732,553** (14 % increase)

These funds were used as follows for the current and past three fiscal years:

- To fully fund a CoE (targeting Latinos/as)
- To partially fund a Medical Case Management (ICM) Program (targeting Latinos/as)

Per agency report the following outcomes were achieved:

- Increased enrollment and maintenance of clients in HIV primary care.
- Increased number of clients released from incarceration accessing HIV primary care.
- Increased client enrollment in mental health services.
- Increased client knowledge of HIV transmission.
- Reduced Incidence of Opportunistic Infections and AIDS related E.R Visits.
- Reduced HIV transmission risk behaviors due to prevention with positives interventions.
