Background Information

- The HIV Prevention Planning Council (HPPC) was founded in 1994
 - Consists of 21-37 members who reflect the local HIV epidemic, as well as the city of San Francisco
 - Has three co-chairs, one governmental and two community.
 - Meets monthly
 - Committees meet monthly or more to accomplish specific goals.

Primary Responsibilities of HPPC Members

1. Contribute to the development of a Comprehensive HIV Prevention Plan for SF.
2. Assess the responsiveness of the health department's application to CDC in addressing HPPC priorities identified in the Comprehensive HIV Prevention Plan.

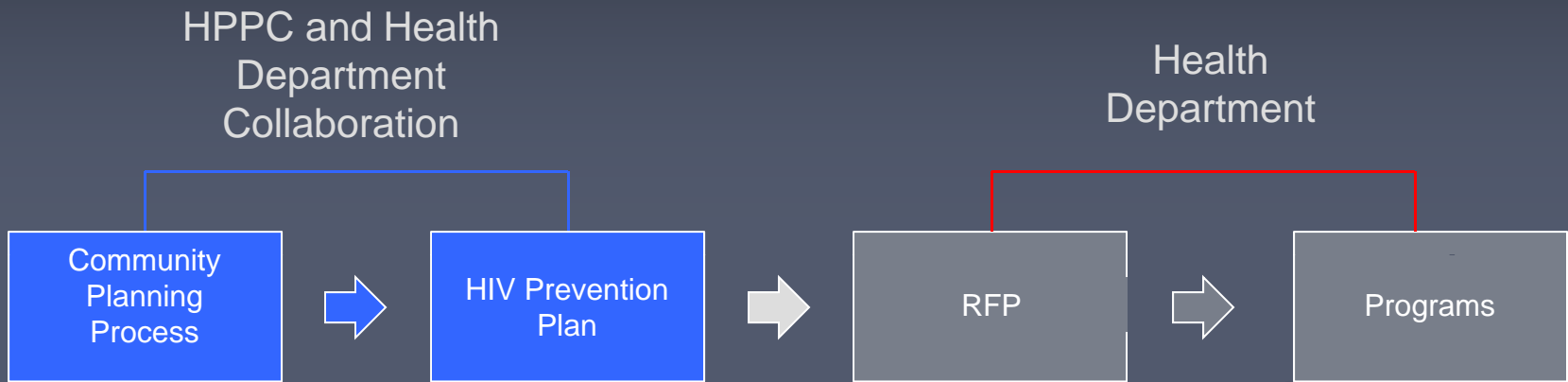
2010 HIV Prevention Plan

- The HIV Prevention Planning Council is required to develop at least one comprehensive HIV Prevention Plan every 5 years, and update annually.
- The objective of the Plan is to guide how prevention programs in SF should respond to the epidemic.

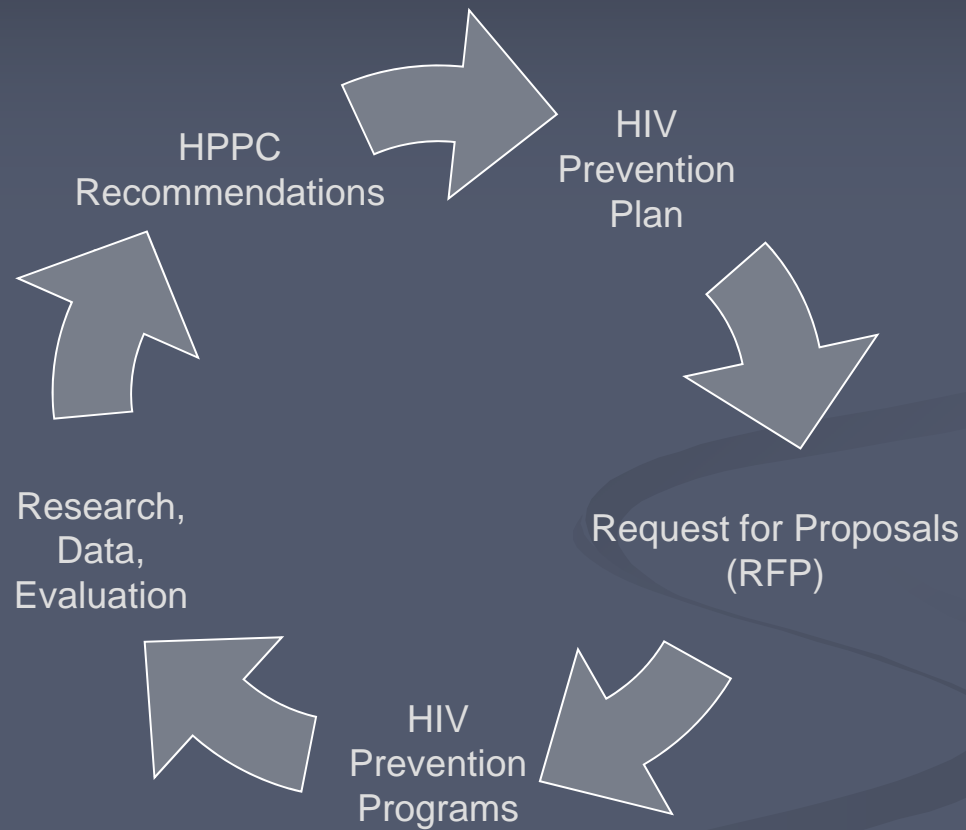
2010 HIV Prevention Plan

- The 2010 HIV Prevention Plan highlights the 5 focus areas that are the focus of prevention efforts in the upcoming years:
 - ❖ HIV Status Awareness
 - ❖ Prevention with Positives
 - ❖ Drivers of HIV in SF
 - ❖ Syringe Access
 - ❖ Structural Change
- These focus areas are woven throughout the 6 chapters of the Plan
